HISTORICAL TIMELINES [PART 2 – 1972 to 1989]

1972

- Curriculum updated to maintain relevance with industry standards.

1973

- Lahore building completed, expanding facilities outside Karachi.
- Membership of International Accounting Standards Committee (IASC) approved, aligning with global accounting standards.

1975

- Name changed to Institute of Cost and Management Accountants of Pakistan (ICMAP) to reflect expanded scope.

1974

- Membership of International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) approved, enhancing international recognition.
- Overseas examination centres established in Saudi Arabia, UAE, Bahrain, Oman, and Tanzania for international students.

1976

- Lahore building becomes functional, supporting local chapters.
- First Memorial Lecture held at Karachi; Prof. A. J. H. Enthoven delivered the lecture to promote professional learning.
- Ms. Roohi Qureshi becomes the first lady Cost & Management Accountant, marking a milestone for gender inclusion.
- Second Shoaib Memorial Lecture held at Karachi; Prof. R. J. Chambers delivered the lecture.

1977

- ICMA Pakistan becomes founding member of IFAC, solidifying global engagement.

1989

- Construction begins on new Gulshan-e-Iqbal campus, Karachi, to accommodate future growth.

1984

- ICMA Pakistan becomes founding member of SAFA (South Asia Federation of Accountants).
- Islamabad building completed, extending institutional presence in the capital.

1980

- ICMA Pakistan becomes founding member of CAPA (Confederation of Asia and Pacific Accountants).
